- The AAHPM Lifetime Achievement Award** recognizes outstanding contributions and significant publications that have helped shape the direction of the field of hospice and palliative medicine. The award winner must agree to make a major presentation at the AAHPM Annual Assembly in the year the award is presented.
- The AAHPM Distinguished Service Award** recognizes outstanding and dedicated service to the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine. The award will be presented to an individual or group that has advanced the mission of the Academy in a significant and lasting way.
- The AAHPM Humanities Award** recognizes person(s) whose work has advanced the relationship between humanities and palliative care, and who have employed the discipline of the humanities to improve end-of-life care. Candidates for the award include poets, artists, musicians, medical educators and others involved in medical humanities in the broadest terms.
- The AAHPM Award for Excellence in Scientific Research in Palliative Care** recognizes meaningful, exemplary research contributions to the field of hospice and palliative care. The recipient is expected to present his/her research within the broad context of the field of hospice and palliative care.
- The AAHPM Josefina B. Magno Distinguished Hospice Physician Award** recognizes a hospice medical director or hospice physician who provides the highest quality services and innovative programs and who demonstrates exemplary dedication to the practice of palliative medicine in a hospice setting.
- The AAHPM Project on Death in American (PDIA) Palliative Medicine National Leadership Award and The AAHPM Project on Death in American (PDIA) Palliative Medicine Community Leadership Award** recognizes physician leaders who have advanced the field of palliative care by the education of the next generation of palliative care leaders at either the national or community level. The award program promotes the visibility and prestige of physicians in both academic and clinical settings who are committed to mentoring future leaders and serving as role models for other health professionals engaged in improving the care of the dying.
